College Teams Battle at 6th Annual NAPTA Troubleshooting Skills Competition in Pasadena, TX

Pasadena, Texas, April 24, 2023 — Teams of college process technology students from across the country competed in the Championship Rounds of the 6th Annual NAPTA Troubleshooting Skills Competition at the LyondellBasell Center for Petrochemical, Energy, & Technology on the campus of San Jacinto College on April 21st and 22nd.

Thirty-two teams from fourteen colleges participated in the Qualifying Rounds of TSC VI in March, and the twelve highest-scoring three-member teams from eight colleges were selected to participate in the Championship Competition. San Jacinto College team **Ravens 2** won the honor of Top Troubleshooting Team, and San Jacinto College team **Ravens 1** and College of the Mainland team **Shakers** took second and third place respectively.

The four-round Championship Competition tested the teams' troubleshooting skills on recognizing and resolving problems with various industry-related scenarios, and while using computer-based simulation and virtual plant environment software.

On Friday, team members participated in process-related activities and mock interviews. Students interacted with attending industry representatives during the mock interview process and while visiting sponsor's booths.
